





Mast Rd Natural Area Acquisition Notes

- Acquired from N.H. Public Golf Courses Inc. by Southeast Land Trust of NH in 2011
- Funding by the Natural Resources Conservation Service Wetland Reserve Program (WRP) & Lamprey River Advisory Committee (LRAC)
- Restoration Component Required
- WRP \$1.6 million
- LRAC \$296,492 match and management fund
- Total Acquisition Cost \$1.9 million



Mast Rd Natural Area Resource Features

- 531 acres
- 6,877 ft. of frontage (4,955 ft. on south side) of the Lamprey River
- 500 ft. on the Piscassic River
- 200 ac. exemplary red maple floodplain forest
- 2nd highest known population of state endangered "button sedge"
- 2 exemplary poor level fens
- Blandings Turtles



Mast Rd Troubled Past

- Portions were logged, stumped and ditched for drainage in the 1980's
- Became an ATV/4x4 playground
- Attracted tons of trash, hundreds of tires, abandoned cars, piggery bldgs., pavement from an outdoor theater, pot plantation
- Abandoned gravel and sand pits
- Sulky track
